Thanks Leann. Seems a systemic lack of an objective fact-based arguments and disturbing motives.

- 1. Survey. This appears to again address navigation, which clearly is not an issue. From multiple actual measurements and as can clearly be seen on overhead views, there is plenty of clearance to both Croker and Corbin buoys, with more deep water in front and around our property and proposed float than anywhere else in Fletcher Bay. Clearance to adjacent docks (Morgan and Croker) is even more.
- 2. Easement/Joint Use Agreement. I think he is trying to make an argument that the only thing that can be allowed is replacing the dock in it's current exact location which is obviously not an option for many reasons beyond pickleweed. Ironically, what we are proposing meets every intent of the joint use agreement by clearing the dock from our neighbors' tidelands, including to better accommodate a dock for them or future owners should they desire to pursue one.
- 3. Adjoining Docks. I agree he completely missed the point. Though there are "straight lines" along sections of outer edges of docks to the east and west, the SHORE is also "straight" in those areas. There are many other sections where the shore is not straight, including for example the 90 degree turn in the channel departing the bay to the west; and if you look to the east, Tim Verhaven's dock "juts out" as the bay constricts. In our case, the shore moves out, and so does the other side of the bay even more, which again results in the widest and most navigable part of the bay. Bottom line, yes our proposal projects 80+ft from the shore just like other docks do on average within 500ft, but with more water in front to get around it.

I think you are right in the biggest complaint is aesthetics, and other issues like navigation are being brought up in an attempt to block the project. Sonja and I are very disappointed, seems very unprofessional and selfish. Particularly surprised with Tom. We just want a dock like everyone else and have done everything we can to follow the rules and didn't expect this kind of backlash.

Fortunately Annie seems to get it and is being extremely patient and professional with all this. Thank you very much for working with us, please let me know if there is anything I can do to help Darren
