Thank you for the email late yesterday to respond to my records request. I don't believe either of these documents are responsive to my request. I have already looked in the link you included above. I also spent almost an hour yesterday leafing page by page through the paper file looking for the document in question.

On page 2 of 6 of the January 24,2017 Traffic Study [attached in your email]. The following text appears: **Trip Assignment**

Trips were assigned to the future campus based on the addresses of the current study population. In addition, the trip distribution was adjusted based on employment centers in the area. Current enrollment show about 50% of school families north of Lowry Farm and 50% south of Lowry Farm.

The April 2016 analysis, assumed a more school traffic from the south, specifically via the SR 305/Sportsman Club Road/Madison Avenue NE intersection (65% of the traffic to/from the south of NE Valley Road), this was assumed based on the school's location in downtown Bainbridge Island. Based on the current distribution of the student population, based on addresses, there are more students residing to the north of Bainbridge Island, than previously assumed. The change in traffic distribution suggests more vehicle traffic to and from the north of the Lowy Farm campus.

I'm looking for the documentation submitted by Madrona that caused the traffic consultant to make significant changes in the trip generation data from the 2016 traffic study to the 2017 analysis [number and direction]. I spoke with Heather Wright yesterday and she noted the CoBI engineer that reviewed the traffic study might have the Madrona documents at their desk.

Thank you in advance for finding this document(s) and emailing a copy of them in time for me to review them before this Thursday's Planning Commission meeting.

Hi Janelle,
The January 24, 2017 (SR 305) traffic impact analysis indicates that the trip generation was adjusted to reflect existing morning conditions observed by school administration at their existing campus, specific to page 1, paragraph 4.
The existing trip information was used to forecast future conditions.
Compared to the April 14, 2016 document:
 AM difference is 5% Afterschool difference is 15%
The differences reflect, a current representation of families with multiple students attending the school, carpooling, and staff with children at the school.
Additionally, the school was able to provide us with a map of their student population which was used to update the trip distribution. This showed more families in Port Orchard, which distributed more traffic to the north of the proposed campus.
The overall conclusions of the April 14, 2016 traffic study do not change.
